The Youth Sports Alliance (YSA) was established in the wake of the 2002 Salt Lake City Olympics to increase the number of children participating in sports utilizing the venues built for the Games. Since then, YSA has led the community in introducing kids to sport and screenfree activities through its afterschool programs along the Wasatch Back and by providing fundraising support to area winter sport clubs. YSA encourages participation by offering meaningful need-based scholarships to students registering for our afterschool programs and to athletes training with our partner clubs.

45A Wins Land Rover Defender Service Award,

In November, YSA was announced as the winner of the Outdoor Accessibility and Education Category of the Land Rover Defender Service Awards. Emily S. Fisher, YSA Executive Director, was on hand at the Destination Defender event in Somerville, Texas, to receive the award from Robin Thurston, CEO of Outside Interactive and Joe Eberhardt, President and CEO of Jaguar Land Rover North America. YSA staff and board members gathered at Red Rock Tap Haus for a watch party that was televised at the event.





Community support from across the Wasatch Back was crucial to our success. We were one of 25 organizations selected out of 685 entries as finalists — five finalists for each of five categories. The winner of each category was selected by popular vote. Everywhere staff and board members went during the campaign — on trails, at churches, and walking through the grocery stores — people let us know that they voted for us, often every day. YSA was grateful to our long-time supporters and new friends who helped us win this campaign. Dozens of businesses, non-profits, Olympians, and just regular folk helped get out the vote on their social media and in their newsletters.

Winning this award will provide a great boost to our programs. Transportation continues to be one of the most costly line items in our Kodiak Get Out & Play and Kodiak ACTiV8 programs. This vehicle will allow us to provide transportation for smaller programs that previously had been cost prohibitive, allowing us to divert these funds to scholarships.



ALUMNA PROFILE



Victoria Rosales learned to ski through YSA's Get Out & Play program as a first grader attending Parley's Park Elementary School. Now, nearly a decade later, Victoria is instructing and inspiring a new generation of young skiers in that same program thanks to another YSA initiative. This year, Victoria passed a rigorous junior ski instructor course taught by PSIA-AASI in partnership with YSA and Park City Mountain.

Her experience with YSA isn't just limited to skiing. Victoria also learned to ice skate and spent afternoons tubing with friends through our programs. For her, these programs were more than just learning new skills; they made her feel like she belonged. She could talk about wipeouts and deep powder on the bus to the mountain or over lunch with her friends.

Victoria now shapes the experiences of local students in the very programs that sparked her passion for skiing. Our program helps write the stories of countless young people in our community, empowering them to not only dream bigger but to step into those dreams to make them real.







During the 2024 Summer Olympic Games in Paris, Victoria spent 10 days in France with a group of 500 students from 37 countries around the world celebrating the values of the Games and showcasing social engagement through sport.

Afterschool Programs





YSA runs afterschool programs introducing kids to sport and screen free activities. Our programs are open to students in four school districts, two charter schools, two independent schools, and home schools throughout Summit and Wasatch Counties. Last year, we offered 154 affordable afterschool classes in four-to-six-week segments. Evidence shows that active kids are more likely to succeed in life — physically, emotionally, socially, and financially. We work to bring these benefits to all children regardless of their finances, gender, race or abilities.

GET OUT & PLAY (GO&P)

At the elementary school level, YSA provides access to affordable group sport lessons. Offerings include a wide range of sports such as skiing, ice skating, mountain biking, golf and more to keep kids active while providing afterschool supervision.

ACTIV8

Middle and junior high school students are offered introductory sport classes, as well as healthy activities designed to get students off their screens. Nearly a decade ago, YSA pioneered middle school and junior high afterschool programming in conjunction with school administrators, students and community members to offer engaging activities for older ages such as biathlon, skeleton, and photography.

More than a quarter of our students receive financial assistance to participate. YSA provides full scholarships to students on the federal free and reduced lunch program and half-scholarships to students living in families who make up to 80% of the area median income.



ATHLETE PROFILE: Orson Colby, Wasatch Luge Club & Team USA

Orson Colby got his start in luge with the Wasatch Luge Club when he was 11. He's now representing the U.S. in international competitions. He credits YSA with making the leap from local competitions to the world stage. "YSA is an incredible organization that has significantly contributed to my success," he says. "YSA funding has helped me attend camps in Lake Placid, as well as travel internationally."

Training on international tracks helped Orson qualify to represent the United States at the 2024 Youth Olympic Games. He cherishes the memories from the Games and aspires to compete in the Olympics, hopefully on his home track in 2034. This summer he accompanied the Salt Lake City Committee for the Games delegation to Paris as part of the official presentation to the Internation Olympic Committee.

Orson plans to continue his athletic career while attending college, aiming to become a physical therapist or athletic trainer to help others with their recovery and training goals.



ATHLETE PROFILE: Josie Johnson, Get Out & Play to Team USA

When Josie Johnson signed up for YSA's Get Out & Play learn-to-ski jump program in second grade, she never imagined that she would one day be tapped for the US Women's Ski Jumping team. In 2021, she joined the team, and by the age of 17, Josie had competed in multiple World Cup competitions and won a silver medal at the Youth Olympic Games. While she gravitated toward ski jumping, Josie also tried bouldering, mountain biking, ice skating, and alpine skiing through YSA's Get Out & Play afterschool program.

"I wouldn't have known about ski jumping without YSA." says Josie.
"I'm so thankful for YSA for all the opportunities and community support they have given me."

Josie's mother, a volunteer with YSA when Josie was in elementary school, witnessed firsthand the joy and support that YSA provides to local children. "As we navigate the world of high-level sport, having YSA's continued support for Josie is something our family really appreciates," she shares.











YSA awarded \$150,525 in need-based training and competition funds last year from the Stein Eriksen YSA Opportunity Endowment. Since the endowment was established in 2014, more than \$1,000,000 in financial support has been provided to Park City's youth, helping them chase their dreams.




